One week later, he checked his set-ups and noticed that the plants in the 3 set-ups grew to different heights as shown below.



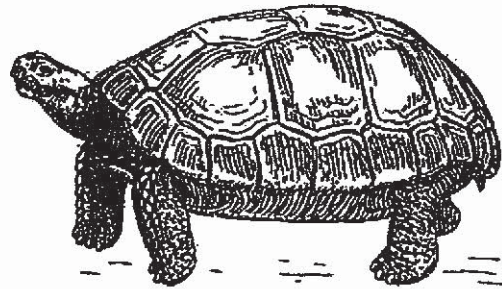

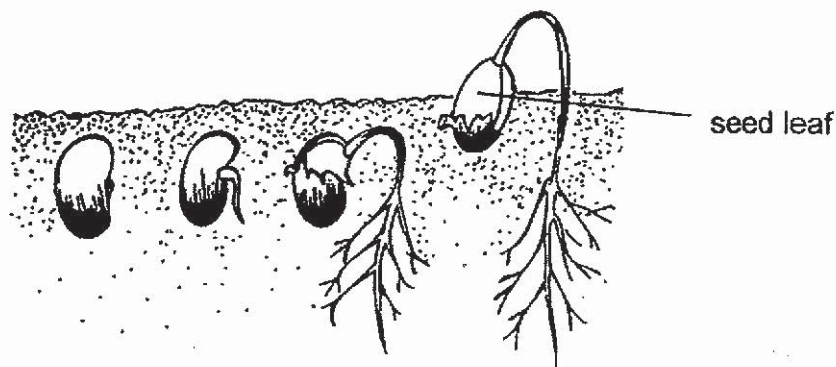

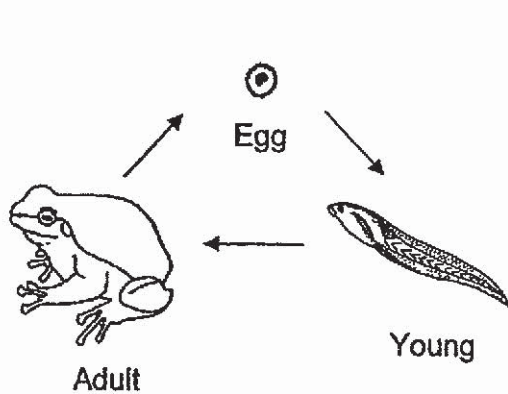

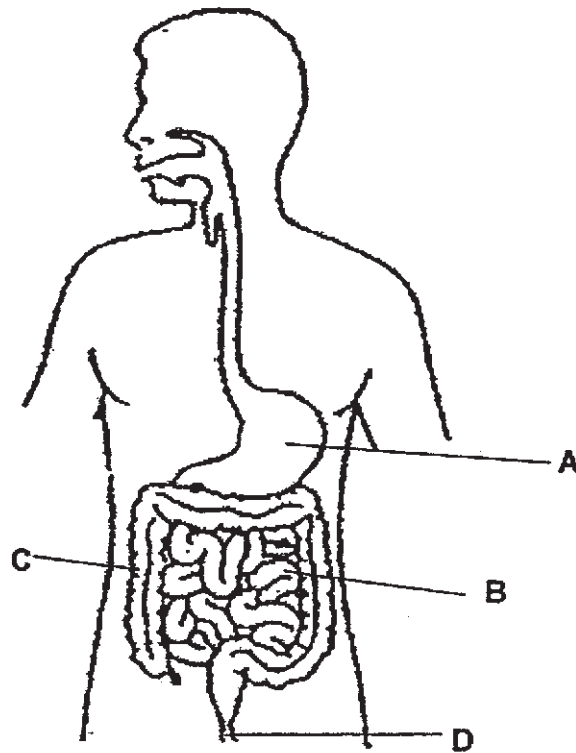
Life cycle Animal X

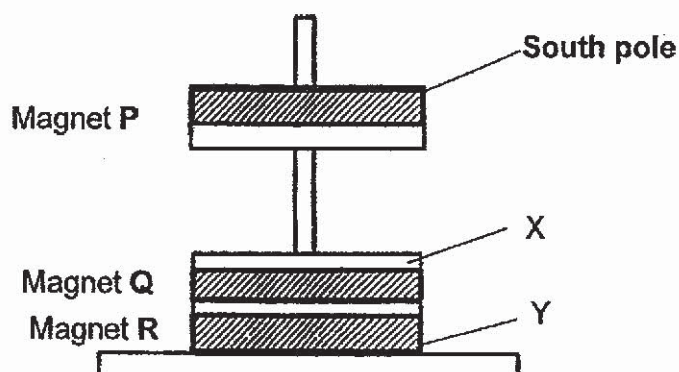

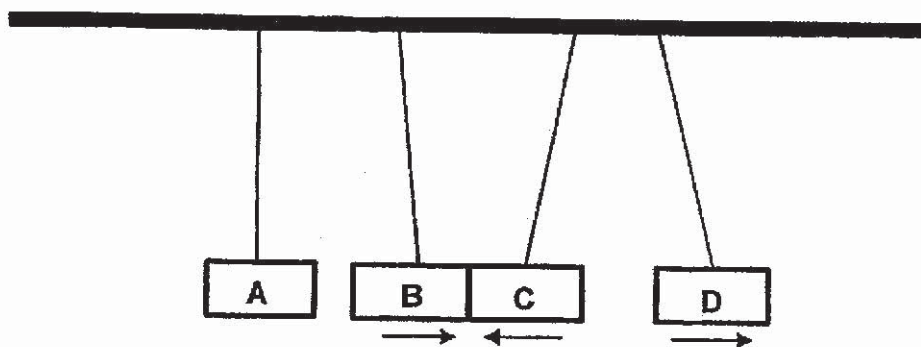

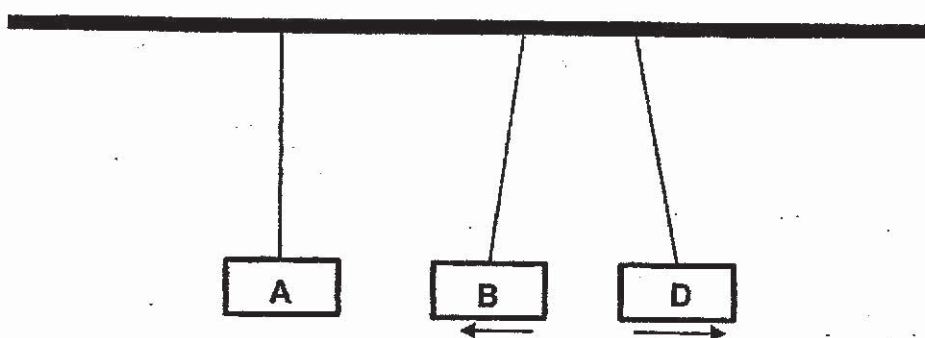

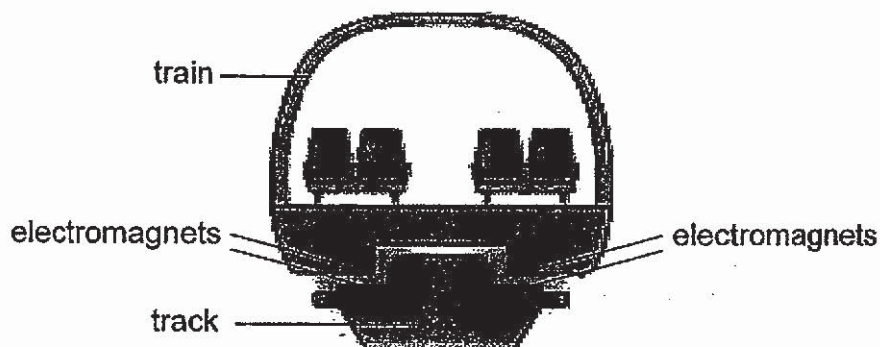
